STARTERS

Barrel House Chicharrón

Crispy fried pork rinds dusted in Cajun spices and served with dipping sauces. 5

Angel's Share Beer Pretzels

Bavarian style salted pretzels served with house made beer-cheese sauce. 8

Halo Fries

Shoestring fries seasoned with fresh rosemary and parmesan cheese. 5

Diablo Fries

Shoestring fries tossed with chopped garlic, lemon juice, cilantro and topped with creamy sriracha. 6

Tap House Chicken Wings

Seasoned and fried crispy, tossed with your choice of house-made sauce: Roasted Garlic and Parmesan, Alabama White BBQ, Marionberry Chipotle, Habanero. 8

Baby spinach, Gorgonzola crumbles, sweet peppers, marinated artichoke hearts topped with apple cider yogurt dressing and candied hazelnuts. 8

Native Fry Bread

Two handmade native fry bread stuffed with your choice of beer-braised chicken or grilled steak. Topped with cheddar, avocado crema, and green cabbage pico. 9

Hank's Steak & Cheddar Melt

In honor of Henry Turner, thin-sliced grilled steak with sweet peppers, Sriracha mayo, and Tillamook white cheddar cheese, melted inside a toasted hoagie, served with chips. 11

Church House Burger

NW country natural beef patty grilled with peppered bacon, Tillamook white cheddar cheese, crispy jalapeños, lettuce, tomato and roasted garlic aioli inside an Angel's Share signature roll, served with chips. 12

Beer-Braised Chicken Sandwich

Chicken breast braised in local beer + tomato sauce. Topped with banana peppers, lettuce, and Gorgonzola cheese inside toasted hoagie, served with chips. 10

DESSERT

Heavenly Fry Bread

Crispy fry bread bites dusted with powdered sugar, marionberry sauce, candied hazelnuts and topped with whipped cream. 7

Holy F***t

A rich and creamy float with vanilla bean ice cream in a stout or root beer topped with whipped cream and ground cinnamon. 8

ABOUT THE PROJECT

Brief Church History

In 1891, the Octorara Presbyterian congregation built a church building located at what is now 1st and Denver in Turner for \$2,598. The congregation used it regularly for services until 1925 when the congregation was dissolved. In 1936, the Assembly of God purchased the building and manse (the pastor's home next door) for \$1,000. The congregation held regular services in the church until 1979, when they moved to a new location they named "Church on the Hill." In 1980, Rev. Wesley Moore purchased the property for \$60,000 and remodeled it to hold services while his family lived in the basement. The final church services were held in the late 1980's, and after that time, the church basement was used as a residence until it was finally left unoccupied in the 1990's. The church building was purchased by Chad and Melissa Casady in 2016, and has undergone extensive renovations in order to repurpose it as a taphouse.

The Tower

Contrary to local folklore, the tower that currently stands behind the church was built in the late 1990's by a previous owner with the intent to install it on top of the church (it was never previously on the building). Unfortunately, significant engineering and structural changes were necessary in order to attach it, and the project was abandoned. It's unknown when the original tower came down, or the reason why, however a picture exists of the church without the tower in 1947, so it is safe to say it wasn't due to the Columbus Day Storm in 1962, which is broadly assumed.

A Church Building Reborn

In 2016, Chad and Melissa Casady purchased the church with the dream of turning it into a taphouse. The building required extensive repairs and renovations in order to make it safe and usable, including a new foundation, new beams and posts, new electrical wiring, and new plumbing. Work began during the summer of 2016, and at every step of the way, materials were evaluated for reusability or repurposing in order to salvage the historic nature of the building.

Old Beams and Posts

Many of the beams and posts were deemed insufficient to carry the weight of the building along with a full house of people. The replaced beams and posts were removed, salvaged, milled, and repurposed to create the incredible bar top as well as the front doors. If you look closely, you can still see the white paint of the old posts on the underside of the bar and in the corners of the front doors.

The Wainscoting

The wainscoting that lines the wall is original, and was removed from walls during demolition, salvaged, planed, and stored for safekeeping until it could be reinstalled again. Whether you pronounce it wainscoting or wainscoting, it's still beautiful.

The Floors

Thankfully, the previous owner covered up the original floors with carpet, which preserved them somewhat, and protected them from damage, especially during demolition. You can still see the faded wood from the carpeted aisles and the marks on the floor where the pews were anchored. Just look down, and you'll see an incredible story beneath your feet.

The Stain Glass

The previous stain glass window for the west window was installed and dedicated in 1958, and then removed in 1979 and put into storage when the congregation reformed as "Church on the Hill." In 2019, a new window for the west wall was made to replace the old one, with the explicit purpose of showcasing the past, present, and future of the community of Turner.
